







# JUVENILE CLEARANCE RATE

- Of the 297 Part I Crimes that were cleared, **91** were by juvenile arrest, meaning:
- **30.6%** of Part I Crimes were cleared by a Juvenile Arrest.
- This is an **increase** of **9.8%**, or 26 juvenile arrests from 2015.

## Number of Juvenile Cases through City Court



Arrests by Year




# TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT



# VOLUNTEERS

- Come from graduating classes of CPA and Extra Eyes
- Logged 3,143 Hours in 2016 (up 179.5 hours from 2015)
- Perform duties such as:
  - Records Entry
  - Fingerprint Analysis
  - Traffic Control
  - Crime Stoppers
  - Juvenile Court
  - Special Patrols
  - Parade Duty
  - Crime Scene Assistance



# So, How Did We Do Compared to 2015?

- 133 fewer arrests were made in 2016
- 2815 fewer Traffic Citations were issued
- .7% fewer cases were cleared
- Part I Crimes overall decreased by 2.6%
- Crime rate decreased by 1.9 crimes per 1,000 persons
- We had the **lowest** recorded number of Part I Crimes in the past 20 years
- Animal Control released more animals than they euthanized for the second year in a row
