


## ABOUT THE HISTORIC PONCA CITY LIBRARY

The Ponca City Library has been a foundation of the community since 1904. In 1904, the women of the Twentieth Century Club organized the first public library in the back of an insurance office on Grand Avenue. Ponca's first library building was constructed through the generosity of Andrew Carnegie on the corner of Fifth and Grand in 1910. As Ponca City grew so did the need for a larger library. The city purchased the land in 1935, and with a grant from the Public Works Administration, the original 18,000 square foot facility was built. In 1989 the library added an extra 10,000 square foot of renovation to the original 1935 building.

Service charge for second notice on late materials (per item)	<b>\$0.50</b>
Replacement of damaged video or jewel case	<b>\$1.00</b>
Replacement for lost or damaged hang up kit bags	<b>\$1.00</b>
Internet use fee for out-of-town area residents (per day)	<b>\$1.00</b>
